# Floristic studies of Piram Island near Gogha, Bhavnagar, Gujarat

Seventy six plant taxa are reported from Piram Island near Gogha of Bhavnagar, which were unexplored so far. A short description, frequency and dominance along with flowering and fruiting times of each taxon have been provided. Key-words— Floristic, Piram Island, Bhavnagar District, Gujarat, India.

### **INTRODUCTION**

PIRAM Island is situated in the Gulf of Cambay near Gogha and Hathab villages of Bhavnagar District, Gujarat. It is nearly 6 nautical miles south of Gogha and 4 nautical miles east of Hathab coast. The island is somewhat rectangular in shape and covers approximately an area of 20 square kilometres at low tide and the land area is reduced to 2.5 x 0.75 square kilometres at high tide. Piram Island consists of rocky and sandy types of soil. West and north coastal areas are sandy. East and southern coastal areas are muddy and sand dunes are also found on the eastern coast Central region of the island is made up of blackish soil. Plant and animal fossils have been reported from the island (Anonymous, 1836).

Although floristic and ecological investigations of the Saurashtra region (Piram Island falls in the region) of Gujarat have been carried out by a number of workers, viz., Cooke (1903-1908), Kapadia (1950), Santapau (1962), Santapau and Janardhanan (1967), Bhatt and Inamdar (1971), Shah (1978), Bole and Pathak (1988), Mitallya (1998) and Bhatt *et al.* (1999) yet no floristic study of Piram island has been done so far.

To fill this gap the authors organized regular trips to Piram Island from 1993 to 2000 in different seasons and collected good number of plants and identified them.

In the enumeration of taxa, the flora of Piram island is described with latest name of plants, their important synonyms, basionym, habit, habitat and locality. The families are arranged according to the classi-

fication of Bentham and Hooker.

### **ENUMERATION OF TAXA**

### Capparaceae

Erect, armed, bushy shrub. Leaves only on young shoots, linear, minute, oblong. Flowers scarlet red, in short corymbs. Fruit globose, green, red when ripe. Common in central region. VN. Kerdo, Fls & Frs: Sept.-May, Loc.-Piram, DCB & KDM 57.

Maerua oblongifolia (Forsk.) A. Rich. Syn. Maerua ovalifolia (DC.) Camb., M. arenaria (DC.) Hk. FOB. 1:43.1903, FOS.1:46.1988, FGS. 1:74. 1978.

Unarmed glabrous shrub. Leaves leathery, oblong. Flowers greenish white, in axillary corymbs. Fruits cylindrical capsule. Rare in central region, VN.-Dudhio hemkand, Fls & Frs:-Oct.-March., Loc.-Piram., DCB & KDM., 58.

#### Malvaceae

Appressed white tomentose undershrub. Leaves ovate, hairy. Flowers yellow, axillary. Fruit carcerule. Frequent, in central region. VN.-Makhmall khapat., Fls & Frs: August- February, Loc.-Piram, DCB & KDM, 22.

Abutilon indicum. (L.) Sw. Syn. Sida indica L. FOB. 1: 102. 1903, FOS. 1:40. 1988, FGS. 1:96. 1978.

Erect, grey tomentose, small shrub. Leaves cordate, ovate, acuminate, toothed. Flowers bright yellow, axillary, solitary. Fruit carcerule. Rare in eastern region. VN.-Khapat, Fls & Frs: Sept.-Mar., Loc.-Piram, DCB & KDM, 59.

Small, hairy herb. Leaves cordate, lobes triangular. Flowers yellow, axillary, solitary. Fruit globose capsule. Common in central region. VN.-Bhonya bala, Fls & Frs: Sept.-Jan., Loc.-Piram, DCB & KDM. 60.

*Sida cordifolia* L. FOB. 1: 99. 1903, FOS. 1: 38. 1988, FGS. 1:115. 1978.

Small, hairy, branched herb. Leaves cordate, crenate, petioles long. Flowers yellow, solitary. Fruit globose capsule. Common in central region. VN.-Bala., Fls & Frs: Aug.-Jan., Loc.-Piram, DCB & KDM., 62.

#### **Tiliaceae**

Corchorus depressus (L.) Stocks Syn. Corchorus antichorus Raensch. FOB.1:159. 1903 FOS. 1:72 1988 FGS, 1:127. 1978.

Radially prostrate herb. Leaves small, oblong to roundish, crenate. Flowers small, yellow, in leaf-opposed fascicles. Fruit cylindric capsules. Common in central plains. VN.-Bahuphali, Fls & Frts: Aug.-Dec., Loc.-Piram, DCB & KDM 23.

Corchorus trilocularis L.FOB.1:158. 1903 FGS, :1:128. 1978.

Annual, hairy herb. Leaves elliptic oblong, serrate, Flowers yellow, 2-3 fascicled. Fruit trigonous capsule. Common, in central plains. VN.-Chhunch, Fls & Frs: Aug.- Oct., Loc.-Piram, DCB & KDM., 61.

Grewia tenax (Forsk.) Fiori Syn. Grewia populifolia Vahl, FOB. 1: 148. 1903, FOS. 1:67. 1988, FGS:1:132. 1978.

Straggling small shrub. Leaves suborbicular, hairy beneath, dentate. Flowers white. Fruit tetra-globose drupe. Rare in eastern region. VN.-Gangeti, Fls & Frs: Jul -Dec., Loc.-Piram, DCB & KDM, 26.

*Triumfetta rotundifolia* Lamk. FOB. 1:157. 1903, FOS. 1:173; 1988, FGS.1:135.

Small herb, Leaves orbicular, hairy, serrate, Flowers yellow, in terminal racemes. Fruit ovoid with hooked spines. Common in central region. VN.-Zipto., Fls & Frs: Aug-Nov., Loc.:-Piram, DCB & KDM, 25.

### Zygophyllaceae

*Tribulus terrestris* L.FOB.1:170. 1903, FOS. 1:76. 1988, FGS. 1:40. 1978.

Prostrate hairy herb. Leaves compound, opposite, leaflets 3-6 pairs, oblong. Flowers yellow, axillary, solitary, Fruit globose spiny. Common in central hilly area. VN.-Bethu gokhru, Fls & Frs: Aug-Feb., Loc.-Piram., DCB & KDM: 24.

### Meliaceae

Azadirachta indica A. Juss. Syn. Melia azadirachta L.FOB, 1:220. 1903, FOS.1:87; FGS. 1:149. 1978.

Tall, deciduous tree. Leaves compound, imparipinnate, leaflets falcate, serrate. Flowers white, fragrant in panicles. Fruit ellipsoid, drupe. Rare, near light house. VN.-Limbo, Fls & Frs: Mar-Jun., Loc.-Piram., DCB & KDM, 19.

### Rhamnaceae

Zizyphus mauritiana Lam. Syn. Zizyphus jujuba (L.) Lam, FOB.1:256. FOS.1:92; FGS.1:155.

Small armed tree. Leaves ovate, oblong. Flowers greenish-yellow, in axillary fascicles. Fruit globose drupe. Rare, near light house. VN.: Bordi. Fls & Frs. Oct-Feb., Loc-Piram, DCB & KDM, 20.

### Vitaceae

Cayratia trifolia (L.) Domin Syn. Cayratia carnosa (Lam.) Gagnep., Vitis carnosa Wall, Vitis

Slender, herbaceous climber,. Leaves trifoliolate, leaflets ovate, suborbicular, crenate. Flowers greenish-white, in axillary cymes. Fruits-globose, berries. Rare, in eastern region. VN.-Khat khatumbo, Fls. & Frs: Aug- Nov. Loc.: Piram., DCB & KDM,27.

### Sapindaceae

Cardiospermum halicacabum L.FOB.1:280. 1903, FOS.1:100. 1988, FGS. 1:163. 1978.

Slender, herbaceous climber with 3-fid tendrils. Leaves ovate, biternate. Flowers white, in terminal cymes. Fruit trigonous capsules. Common, in central region. VN.-Kagdolia, Fls & Frs. Aug-Dec., Loc.-Piram, DCB & KDM, 63.

### Anacardiaceae

Evergreen, branched tree. Leaves lanceolate, acute, coriaceous. Flowers small, greenish yellow, in large terminal panicles. Fruit fleshy, drupes. Rare, near light house. VN.-Ambo, Fls & Frs: Jan.- June., Loc.-Piram, DCB & KDM, 18.

### Moringaceae

Small, tree with soft woods. Leaves tripinnate, leaflet ovate. Flowers, creamy white, in axillary panicles. Fruit cylindrical, ribbed capsules. Rare, near light house. VN.-Sargavo, Fls & Frs: Major part of the year, Loc.-Piram, DCB & KDM, 17.

### **Fabaceae**

Small, erect, herb. Leaves trifoliolate, leaflet obovate. Flowers yellow. in treminal racemes. Fruit subglobose pods, beaked. Common, in central region. VN.-Ranmethi, Fls & Frs: Aug.-Jan., Loc.-Piram., DCB & KDM, 28.

Indigofera linnaei Ali Syn. Indigofera enneaphylla L. Indigofera prostrata (Burm.f.)

Small, prickly, branched herb. Leaves paripinnate, leaflets 10-20 pairs, linear. Flowers yellow, in axillary and terminal racemes. Fruit falcate, drooping pods. Rare, in western region. VN.-Ikad, Fls & Frs: Aug.-Feb., Loc.-Piram, DCB & KDM, 65.

Small, branched undershrub. Leaves unifoliate, leaflets obovate. Flowers purple. Fruit oblong, cylindrical pods. Rare, in northern region. VN.-Jethimal, Fls & Frs: Aug.-Feb., Loc.-Piram, DCB & KDM, 66.

*Tephrosia purpurea* (L.) Pers. Syn. *Cracca purpurea L.* FOB. 1:346. 1903, FOS.1:136. 1988, FGS. 1:249. 1978.

Small, erect undershrub. Leaves imparipinnate, leaflets obovate, hairy beneath. Flowers purple, in terminal racemes. Fruit flat, oblong pods. Common in central region. VN.-Sarpankho, Fls & Frs: July-March., Loc.-Piram. DCB & KDM, 30.

# Caesalpiniaceae

Small deciduous tree. Leaves pinnate, leaflets 10-20 pairs, linear oblong. Flowers creamy white, in

terminal racemes. Fruit flat, long, pods. Rare, near light house. VN.-Sandhesaro., Fls & Frs: March-August, Loc-Piram, DCB & KDM, 16.

#### Mimosaceae

Small armed shrub, Leaves bipinnate, spines, divaricate, pinnae 4-8 pairs. Flowers reddish yellow, fragrant, in heads. Fruit pod. Rare, in southern coast. VN.-Tal baval., Fls & Frs: Nov.- April., Loc.-Piram, DCB & KDM, 14.

Acacia nilotica (L.) Del. Syn. Acacia arabica Willd. FOB. 1:472. 1903, FOS. 1:204. 1988, FGS. 1:283. 1978.

Armed, small tree. Leaves bipinnate, stipules modified into two large spines. Flowers bright yellow, in globose heads. Fruit moniliform pods, compressed grey. Rare, near light house. VN.-Deshi baval, Fls & Frs: July-April., Loc.-Piram, DCB & KDM, 15.

Acacia senegal (L.) Willd. Syn. Mimosa senegal L. FOB.1:478. 1903, FOS. 1:208. 1988, FGS:1:285. 1978.

Armed large shrub. Leaves bipinnate, spines usually three at node. Flowers greenish-white, in axillary spikes. Fruit oblong pods. Common in northern and southern regions. VN.-Gorad, Fls & Frs: May-February, Loc.-Piram, DCB & KDM, 13.

Dichrostachys cinerea (L.) Wight & Am. Syn. Mimosa cinerea L. FOB.1:468. 1903, FOS. 1:202, 1988, FGS. 1:288. 1978.

Armed shrub. Leaves bipinnate, spines small. Flowers white-pink-yellow, in axillary spikes. Fruit twisted pods. Rare, in western region. VN.-Mordhundhiyu, Fls & Frs: July-January, Loc.-Piram, DCB & KDM, 31.

Mimosa hamata Willd. FOB. 1:471. 1903, FOS. 1:202. 1988, FGS. 1:290. 1978.

Much branched, small shrub with curved and straight spines. Leaves bipinnate. Flowers purple. in globose heads. Fruit oblong pods. Common in central region. VN.-Kal baval, Fls & Frs: Aug.-Feb., Loc. Piram, DCB & KDM, 12.

Pithecellobium duice (Roxb.) Bth. Syn. Mimosa dulcis Roxb. Inga duice Willd. FOB. 1:485. 1903, FOS. 1:211 1988, FGS. 1:291. 1978.

Armed, tall tree. Leaves compound, bilobed, Stipules modified into spines. Flowers creamy white, in axillary and terminal paniculate globose heads. Fruit spirally twisted pods, arillate. Rare, near light house. VN.-Goras amli, Fls & Frs: December-April, Loc.-Piram, DCB & KDM, 11.

Armed, large shrub. Leaves bipinnate, pinnae 4-6, leaflets oblong. Flowers yellow, in axillary pendulous spikes. Fruit fleshy pods, Abundant, throughout island. VN.-Gando baval, Fls & Frs: Throughout the year, Loc.-Piram, DCB & KDM, 01.

### Lythraceae

Much branched shrub. Leaves opposite elliptic, acute. Flowers white, fragrant, in terminal panicles. Fruit globose capsules. Rare, near light house. VN.-Mendi, Fls. & Frs.: Major part of the year, Loc.-Piram, DCB & KDM, 10.

### Cucurbitaceae

Slender, herbaceous climber. Leaves broadly ovate. Flowers white, axillary, solitary. Fruit oblong pepo. Common in western. & southern region. VN.-Tindora, Fls & Frs: Aug-Dec., Loc.-Piram., DCB & KDM, 32.

Cucumis callosus (Rottl.) Cogn. Syn. Cucumis trigonous Roxto., Bryonia callosa Rottl. FOB.1:569. 1903, FOS. 1:249. 1988, FGS:1:321. 1978.

Slender, herbaceous climber. Leaves 5-7 lobed, hairy, ovate. Flowers yellow. Fruit globose, berries. Rare, in central region. VN.-Gay Vasukada, Fls & Frs: Aug-Dec, Loc.-Piram, DCB & KDM, 34.

### Rubiaceae

Hispidly hairy herb. Leaves ellipitic, acute, stipules membranous. Flowers pale blue. Fruit capsule. Common in central region. VN.-Ganthiyu, Fls & Frs: July-Jan., Loc.-Piram, DCB & KDM, 67.

### Asteraceae

Small, diffuse, prostrate herb. Leaves opposite, oblong, hairy. Flowers white, heads. Pappus absent. Common in central region. VN.-Bhangro, Fls & Frs: Jul-Dec., Loc.-Piram, DCB & KDM, 33.

Vernonia cinerea (L.) Less. Syn. Conyza cinerea L. FOB. 2:65. 1906, FOS. 2:39. 1988, FGS. 1:398. 1978.

Erect annual herb. Leaves ovate. Flowers pale to bright purple, in terminal paniculate heads. Pappus hairy, white. Common in central region. VN.-Sahdevi. Fls & Frs: Aug - Jan., Loc.-Piram, DCB & KDM, 35.

Evergreen small tree. Leaves opposite, ovate glabrous. Flowers yellow, in panicles. Fruit globose, drupes, pink. Rare, near light house. VN.-Piludi, Fls & Frs: Sept-Feb., Loc.-Piram, DCB & KDM, 02.

### Asclepiadaceae

Small shrub with milky juice. Leaves opposite, decussate, oblong, sessile. Flowers purple, in umbellate cymes. Fruit follicles. Seeds comate. Common in central region. VN.-Ankdo, Fls & Frs: Major part of year, Loc.-Piram, DCB & KDM, 09.

Leptadenia reticulata (Retz.) Wight & Am. Syn.

Slender, perennial climber. Leaves cordate, hairy beneath. Flowers creamy white, in umbellate cymes. Fruit paired follcies, softly echinate. Common in central region. VN.-Nagla dudhell, Fls & Frs: July-Feb., Loc.-Piram, DCB & KDM, 37.

#### **Ehretiaceae**

Small tree. Leaves oblanceolate. Flowers white, in cymes. Fruit ovoid, drupes, orange when ripe. Rare, in eastern region. VN.-Gundi, Fls & Frs: February-June., Loc.- Piram, DCB & KDM, 03.

### Convolvulaceae

Small, erect, hairy herb. Leaves ovate, hairy. Flowers white, in clusters. Fruit ovoid capsules. Common, in eastern region. VN.-Rudanti, Fls & Frs: Aug-Feb., Loc.-Piram, DCB & KDM, 38.

*Ipomoea aquatica* Forsk. FOB. 2:315. 1906, FOS. 2:108. 1988, FGS. 1:468. 1978.

Aquatic, creeping herb with hollow stems, rooting at nodes. Leaves ovate, lanceolate. Flowers purple, in axillary cymes, Fruit ovoid, capsules. Common in central region. VN.-Jalgamini, Fls. & Frs. August-

December., Loc.-Piram, DCB & KDM, 69.

*Ipomoea pes-caprae* (L.) Sw. Syn. *Ipomoea biloba* Forsk. FOB. 2:318. 1906, FOS. 1988, 2:112. 1978. FGS:1:472.

Perennial, herbaceous creeper, rooting at nodes. Leaves bilobed, fleshy. Flowers purple, in axillary cymes. Fruit globose, capsules. Common in southern coast. VN.-Maryad vel, Fls & Frs: Aug-Jan., Loc.-Piram, DCB & KDM, 39.

*Ipomoea pes-tigridis* L. FOB. 2:320. 1906, FOS: 2. 113. 1988, FGS. 1:472. 1978.

Herbaceous climber, stem brown, hairy. Leaves paemately 5-9 lobed. Flowers white, in axillary cymes. Fruit ovoid, capsules. Common in central region. VN.-Waghpadi, Fls & Frs: Aug.-Dec., Loc.-Piram, DCB & KDM, 41.

### Solanaceae

Small herb. Leaves broadly ovate, triangular. Flowers white, solitary. Fruit globose, berries. Rare, near light house. VN.-Dhaturo, Fls & Frs: Aug - Jan., Loc.-Piram, DCB & KDM, 40.

*Physalis minima* L. FOB. 2:340. 1906, FOS. 2:132. 1988, FGS. 1:523. 1978.

Small, diffuse herb. Leaves ovate, acute. Flowers yellow, solitary. Fruit berries, red when ripe. Common in central region. VN., Popta, Fls & Frs: Aug.-Nov., Loc.-Piram., DCB & KDM, 70.

#### Pedaliaceae

Small, annual, much branched herb. Leaves opposite, fleshy, serrate. Flowers yellow, axillary solitary. Fruit hard, spiny drupe. Common, in central regon VN.-Ubhu gokharu, Fis & Frs: July-Dec., Loc.-Piram, DCB & KDM, 42.

### Martyniaceae

Martynia diandra Glox. Syn. Martynia annua L. FOB. 414. 1906, FOS. 2:164. 1988, FGS. 1:524. 1978.

Erect, annual herb. Leaves opposite, cordate, suborbicular. Flowers purple, in lax racemes. Fruit drupes, horned. Common in central region. VN.-Vinchhudo., Fls & Frs: Aug.-Dec., Loc.-Piram, DCB & KDM: 43.

### Acanthaceae

Andrographis echioides (L.) Nees. Syn. Justicia echioides L. FOB. 2:451. 1906, FOS. 2:168. 1988, FGS. 1:528. 1978.

Small, hairy, annual herb. Leaves elliptic, opposite. Flowers white with purple dots, in axillary racemes. Fruit elliptic, capsules. Rare in central region. VN.-Kariyatu, Fls & Frs. Aug.-Nov., Loc.-Piram, DCB & KDM, 71.

#### Avicenniaceae

Avicennia marina (Forsk.) Vierh. Syn. Aviceinnia officinalis L.Var. alba Hkf. Seeura marina Forsk. FOB. 2: 517. 1906, FOS. 2:197. 1988, FGS. 1:557. 1978.

Evergreen shrub or small tree. Leaves ovatelanceolate, acute at apex. Flowers yellow, sessile. Fruit capsules. Common in eastern and southern coasts. VN.-Tiwar, Fls & Frs: May-July., Loc.-Piram, DCB & KDM, 04.

Avicennia officinalis L. FOB. 2:517. 1906, FOS. 2:197 1988, FGS:1:557. 1978.

Small, evergreen tree. Leaves elliptic, oblong, obtuse at apex. Flowers yellow, sessile. Fruit capsules. Common in eastern and southern coasts. VN.- Tamar, Fls & Frs: Apr.-July., Loc.-Piram, DCB & KDM, 05.

#### Lamiaceae

Leucas cephalotes (Roxb.ex Roth.) Spr. Syn. Phlomis cephalotes Roxb. FOB. 2:549. 1906, FOS. 2:218. 1988, FGS. 1:572. 1978.

Small, hairy herb. Leaves ovate, crenate, hairy. Flowers white, sessile, in globose whorls. Fruit nutlets. Common in central region. VN.-Kubo, Fls & Frs: Aug.- Jan., Loc.-Piram, DCB & KDM, 44.

Ocimum canum Sims. Syn. Ocimum americanum L. FOB. 2:521. 1906, FGS:1:577. 1978.

Annual, much branched, aromatic herb. Leaves

elliptic-lanceolate. Flowers white, in terminal verticillaster. Fruit nutlets. Common in central region. VN.-Takmaria. Fls & Frs : Aug.- Dec., Loc.-Piram, DCB & KDM, 46.

### Nyctaginaceae

Boerhavia diffusa L. Syn. Boerhavia repens L.FOB:2:563.1906, FOS. 2:228. 1988, FGS.1:587. 1978.

Perennial, diffuse herb. Stem purplish, thickened at nodes. Leaves opposite, ovate. Flowers pink, axillary. Fruit achenes. Common in whole island. VN.-Satodi, Fls & Frs: July-Jan., Loc.-Piram, DCB & KDM, 45.

#### Amaranthaceae

Achyranthes aspera L. var. argentea Hook. FOB. 2:508. 1906, FOS. 2:233. 1988, FGS.1:587. 1978.

Erect, much branched herb. Leaves ovate-elliptic, tomentose beneath. Flowers greenish white, in terminal spikes. Fruit utricles. Common in central region. VN.-Anghedo, Fls & Frs: Sept.-Jan., Loc.- Piram, DCB & KDM, 47.

Aerva javanica (Burm.f.) Juss.ex. Schultes. Syn. Celosia lanata. L., Iresine javanica Burm. f. FOB. 2:578. 1906, FOS. 2:234. 1988, FGS. 1:588. 1978.

Erect, woody, tomentose, small shrub. Leaves linear oblong. Flowers greenish-white, small, in spikes. Fruit utricles. Common in central region, VN.-Gorakh ganjo, Fls & Frs: July-Jan., Loc.-Piram, DCB & KDM, 49.

Aerva lanata (L.) Juss. Syn. Achyranthes lanata L.FOB. 2:578. 1906, FOS. 2:234. 1988, FGS.1:588. 1978.

Small, erect or diffuse herb. Leaves obovate, elliptic, obtuse. Flowers white, in axillary spikes. Fruit minute, utricles. Common in central region. VN.-Gorakh ganjo, Fls & Frs: Aug-Dec., Loc.-Piram, DCB & KDM, 48.

Digera muricata (L.) Mart. Syn. Digera arvensis Forsk. FOB. 2: 572. 1906, FOS. 2: 240. 1988, FGS. 1: 595. 1978.

Small, annual herb. Leaves elliptic-ovate. Flow-

ers pinkish white, in axillary spikes. Fruit globose, utricles. Common in central region. VN.-Kanejaro, Fls & Frs: Aug.-Dec., Loc.-Piram., DCB & KDM, 72.

Pupalia lappacea (L.) Juss. Syn. Achyranthese lappacea L. FOB . 2:583. 1906, FOS. 2:243. 1988, FGS .1: 597.

Erect, hairy herb. Leaves elliptic, tomentose. Flowers greenish-yellow, in terminal spikes. Fruit ovoid, utricles. Rare in central region. VN.-Dholo zipto, Fls & Frs: Aug.-Dec., Loc.-Piram., DCB & KDM, 73.

### Chenopodiaceae

Suaeda maritima (L.) Dum. Syn. Chenopodium maritimum L. FOB. 2: 592. 1906, FGS. 1:601. 1978.

Annual, erect herb. Leaves fleshy, linear-oblong. Flowers greenish. Fruit utricle. Rare in southern coast. VN.-Morad., Fls & Frs Sept.-Dec., Loc.-Piram., DCB & KDM, 76.

Suaeda nudiflora (Willd.) Moq. Syn. Salsola nudiflora Willd. FOB. 2:591. 1906, FOS, 2:251. 1988, FGS. 1:601. 1978.

Prstrate herb. Leaves linear-oblong, spathulate, fleshy. Flowers greenish, in axillary and terminal spikes. Fruit ovoid, utricle. Common in coastal areas. VN.-Morad., Fls & Frs: Sept.-Feb., Loc.-Piram, DCB & KDM, 50.

#### Moraceae

Ficus benghalensis L. FOB. 3:145. 1908, FOS. 2:293. 1988, FGS. 2:644. 1978.

Large evergreen tree. Leaves elliptic, ovate, obtuse, coriaceous. Flowers in globose receptacle. Fruit globose, red. Rare, near light house. VN.-Vadio, Fls. & Frs: Sept. - March, Loc.-Piram, DCB & KDM, 06.

Ficus tsiela Roxb. Syn. Ficus amplissima Sm. FOB. 3:150. 1906; FOS. 2:292. 1988, FGS. 2:643. 1978.

Deciduous tree. Leaves elliptic ovate obtuse. Flowers in globose receptacle. Fruit ovoid, red. Rare, near light house. VN.-Pipar, Fls & Frs: Sept-Apr., Loc.-Piram, DCB & KDM, 07.

### Commelinaceae

Commelina benghalensis L. FOB. 3:291. 1908, FOS. 3:323. 1988, FGS. 2. 687. 1978.

Small, annual herb. Leaves ovate, sessile. Flowers light blue. Fruit capsules. Common in central region. VN.-Shishmuliu, Fls & Frs: Aug-Oct., Loc.-Piram, DCB & KDM, 51.

Commelina forskalaei Vahl , FOB. 3:292. 1908, FOS:3:324. 1988, FGS. 2:687. 1978.

Small, annual herb, rooting at lower nodes. Leaves linear, oblong, undulate. Flowers blue. Fruit oblong, capsule. Common in central region. VN.-Shishmuliu Fls & Frs: Aug - Oct., Loc.-Piram, DCB & KDM, 52.

#### Arecaceae

Borassus flabellifer L. FGS. 2:692. 1978.

Tall tree with annular scars. Leaves in terminal crown, fan-shaped, coriaceous. Flowers minute, cremy-white. Fruit drupes. Rare, near light house. VN.-Tad, Fls & Frs; March-May., Loc.-Piram., DCB & KDM, 08.

## Cyperaceae

Cyperus alopecuroides Rottb. Syn. Juncellus alopecuroides (Rottb.) Cl.FGS. 2:720. 1978.

Rhizomatous, perennial herb. Leaves linear. Flower in terminal paniculate spikes. Fruit nut. Common in central region. Fls & Frs: Sept-Nov., Loc.-Piram, DCB & KDM, 53.

Cyperus rotundus L. FOB. 3:385 1908, FOS. 3:357. 1988, FGS. 2:735. 1978.

Rhizomatous, perennial herb. Leaves linear, Small, accuminate. Flowers in compound umbellate spikes. Fruit oblong, nut. Common in central region. VN.-Moth, Fls & Frs: Aug-Dec., Loc.-Piram., DCB & KDM, 74.

#### Poaceae

Aeluropus lagopoides (L.) Tri.ex. Thw. Syn. Aeluropus villosus Trin ex.L.FOB. 3:567. 1908, FOS. 3:383. 1988, FGS 2;775. 1978.

Perennial, prostrate herb. Leaves lanceolate, acuminate, Flowers white, in subglobose spike. Fruit

caryopsis. Common in eastern & western regions. Fls & Frs: Aug-Mar., Loc.- Piram, DCB & KDM, 54.

Cynodon dactylon (L.) Pers. Syn. Panicum dactylon. L. FOB. 3:554. 1908, FOS. 3:441. 1988, FGS. 2:808. 1978.

Perennial, prostrate herb, rooting at nodes. Leaves linear, acute. Flowers in terminal umbellate spikes. Fruit caryopsis. Common in central region. VN.-Durva, Fls & Frs: Aug-Feb., Loc.-Piram, DCB & KDM, 55.

Dactyloctenium aegyptium (L.) P. Beauv. Syn. Eleusine aegyptiaca (L.) Desf. FOB. 3. 560. 1908: FOS. 3:412. 1988, FGS. 2:808. 1978.

Annual, decumbent herb, rooting at the nodes. Leaves linear, acute. Flowers in terminal 2-6 digitately congested spikes. Fruit globose, caryopsis. Common in central region. VN.-Chaman chotlo, Fls & Frs: Aug.- Dec., Loc.-Piram, DCB & KDM, 56.

Desmostachya bipinnata (L.) Stapf. Syn. Eragrostis cynosuroides (Retz.) P Beauv., Poa cynosuroides Rotz. FOB. 3:550. 1908, FOS. 3:414. 1988, FGS. 2:809. 1978.

Perennial, tufted herb. Leaves linear, sharp on margins, ligule hairy. Flowers in painculate spike. Fruit caryopsis, grains minute. Rare, near light house. VN.-Dabhdo, Fls & Frs: Aug-Dec. Loc.-Piram, DCB & KDM, 75.

A total of seventy six taxa comprising 37 herbs, 8 climbers, 17 shrubs and 14 trees have been recorded from the Piram Island. Majority of the plant taxa are herbs and climbers found during monsoon season only. The whole island is coverd by the dominant exotic species *Prosopis chilensis* (Molina) Stuntz. The eastern and southern coasts of the island are covered by two species of *Aviceinnia*. Near the light house there is a single male palm plant of *Borassus flabellifer* L.
